Hospital Homebound in Alabama



Is my child eligible?

Children with chronic illnesses can receive hospital- or home-based instruction through the Hospital Homebound (HHB) program.

To receive HHB educational accommodations, your child must:

- » Be absent from school for a medically diagnosed illness or disability for at least three continuous weeks.
- » Have doctor certification that medical, mental, or emotional conditions prevent school attendance.



How much instruction will my child receive?

Generally, your child will receive **five hours** of direct instruction per week.



How long can my child receive HHB services?

Schools provide HHB services as long as medically necessary.



What is the HHB application process?

First, submit the request for HHB services to your child's home school with doctor certification.

Then, work with your child and their school to develop and implement a Homebound Services Plan, which will be governed by the requirements of the district's Section 504 policy. If your child is already has an IEP, then their IEP team will develop and implement the plan.

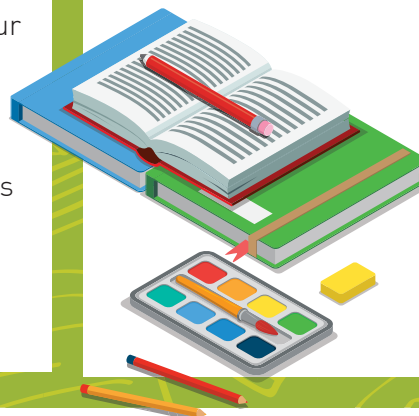
